members at Restaurante Sucede in the historic old city for an excellent dinner. Not only was it a great pleasure to endorse such a new venture but it was also a delight to explore what the city had to

offer. Any members of the Society would be made most welcome there and the city is, in any event, well worth a visit in its own right.



BRANCH EVENT: WESSEX, UK

The Wessex Branch visited the Bombay Sapphire Distillery on 21st April. The day started with a "routier" lunch at La Parisienne, in the pretty market town of Romsey. From there we travelled to the Laverstoke Mill, just to the north of Winchester. The members were introduced to an impressive display of the history of Gin, the distilling processes and most interestingly to smell and taste the many dried Botanicals used in the Bombay Sapphire's production. The final highlight of this two hour experience was a cocktail prepared for each member to their individual tastes. Architecturally the well maintained and preserved Victorian Mill lies within an attractive setting and is

complimented by two superb intertwined glass houses which contain living examples of all the ten botanicals found in Bombay Sapphire. A day thoroughly enjoyed by all.



FESTIVAL: SONOMA, USA

Over 120 members gathered in Sonoma to explore the wines, winemakers and vineyards of Sonoma County. Some vineyards in Sonoma escaped the phylloxera epidemic and now have vines older than 100 years, whose fruit gives extra depth to



many of their wines. The delegates heard many tales of the ups and downs of the wine industry, grubbing up apple orchards to plant vines in good times, to bootlegging to survive the 'Prohibition', and rebuilding the oldest vineyard after earthquakes. An outside dinner at Kendall Jackson Estate in their vegetable and herb garden was a highlight of the festival. Oysters, Dungeness Crab, Liberty Duck, Black Angus beef, and a wide range of locally produced cheeses were a delight. A visit to Sonoma is highly recommended so watch out for the next IWFS monograph to help you start planning.

The London Festival committee has sourced these high quality, fair trade, Panama hats for members. They are a stylish way to protect you from the summer



BRANCH FOCUS: ST JAMES'S



The St James's Branch of the IWFS was founded in 1993 at the initiative of Hugo Dunn-Meynell and Michael Broadbent and was effectively a revival of the Lucullus Club of the Society, established in the 1930s by Nubar Gulbenkian and inevitably wound up in 1939 with the outbreak of the Second World War. The object of the branch was to hold wine and food events of the highest possible quality for

a small number of members without the usual budget restrictions and in accordance with André Simon's motto: 'not too much, but the best'. The first branch Chairman was Stephen Matthews, the first event was a dinner for 22 at The Connaught on 9th June 1993 in honour of Harry Waugh on his 80th birthday, and the second one was a dinner for 20 at The Hilton in honour of Robert Monday who also turned 80 on that year! In 1996 Stephen Matthews stepped down as Chairman and was succeeded by Ari Sofianos, who holds the position to this day. Today the branch has grown to 75 members and holds about ten events per year-our favourite haunts include The Dorchester, The Ritz, The Waterside Inn, Roux at The Landau, The Ledbury, and The Sportsman in Kent to name but a few. A lot of effort goes into the planning of every meal, including a prior tasting during which we sample several dishes against various wines in order to select the final menu for our event. Numbers at our events are usually limited to between 20-30, depending on the size of the establishment's private dining facilities. An exception is The Ritz, where we will be returning this year for a black tie reception and dinner on Monday 23rd October to be held jointly with the London Branch - The Ritz Music Room, where we will be dining, can take up to 60 quests, so we are able to welcome a small number of members from other branches to this event. Annual General Meeting

We will be holding the Europe Africa Zone's second Annual General Meeting in London on Sunday 24th September 2017 at 1715. The AGM will take place at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, 100 Cromwell Road, London, SW7 4ER, just a few yards from Gloucester Road Tube Station. From 1700 there will be a glass of something fizzy to welcome you before the meeting itself.

Black Tie Dinner: HQS Wellington

A Black Tie Dinner on HQS Wellington will follow the AGM. Moored at Temple Stairs – five minutes' walk from Temple Tube Station – this last surviving Grimsby class sloop saw service during the Second World War. She has served as the headquarters of the Honourable Company of Master Mariners since 1948. As well as a four-course meal in the Court Room we will enjoy an aperitif on the Quarter Deck, taking full advantage of the fabulous panoramic views from St. Paul's to the London Eye. The journey from the hotel, where the AGM will take place, to HQS Wellington will be approximately 20 minutes via the District or Circle lines.

Annual Branch Representatives Meeting

To make the best use of the time, we have also arranged the Annual Branch Representatives Meeting to take place on the same day; together with sub-committee meetings on Events, PR/Marketing, Membership – including new Branches, and Electronic Communications.

All Branches are entitled to send representatives to the ABRM and we hope to see every Branch represented on 24th September.

The Sub-Committee meetings are a new departure for EAZ. All members are welcome to join the sub-committee which appeals to them, or more than one if you wish. We hope you will take this opportunity to help shape our work for 2018 and beyond.

Stay a night or two

Mindful of the high costs of meeting in London, we have negotiated an advantageous rate with the hotel which will apply both on Sunday night and Monday night, enabling members to stay on for a second day in London and perhaps take in a show. Even for the most popular shows, tickets are usually more readily available on Monday evenings and Mondays are also good days for the block buster exhibitions at the big museums and galleries. But you do still have to book in advance.

Because of its proximity to Gloucester Road Tube Station, which is served by the Piccadilly, District and Circle lines, the hotel is well placed for those wanting a couple of days away. It is just one stop from the museums in Kensington and two from Harrods and Harvey Nicols. The hotel was fully refurbished in 2016 and, a rarity in central London, has a one-acre garden.
