OUR FESTIVALS **NEW ZEALAND** APZ AGM WEEKEND 8-10 MARCH 2019 AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

Many thanks to Rowan Moss, President of Auckland Branch, for a wonderful festival program in New Zealand in March. 85 members attended the main festival in Auckland.



Highlights included the opening dinner on the marina at *Sails* where we enjoyed a Maori welcome, a menu including some of New Zealand's amazing lamb – wickedly good – and examples of NZ's top two grape varieties, Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir. NAPIER/HAWKE'S BAY PRE-TOUR

Prior to the main festival in Auckland, a charter flight to Napier from Auckland found almost 40 members arrive in New Zealand's oldest and second largest wine region, Hawke's Bay. Known for its full bodied reds such as Syrah, Merlot and Cabernet, as well as rich Chardonnays, it provided a mecca of wineries for our attendees to visit, such as Craggy Range, Church Road, Mission Estate and Brookfields. One of the highlights of the trip was a visit to Church Road Winery where a terrific final dinner included a demonstration of the synergy to be gained with appropriate food and wine pairing. A very insightful and memorable experience.



Napier is also considered to be the Art-Deco capital of New Zealand, very quaint and full of character. Rebuilt in 1931 after an earthquake, members enjoyed the tour of this historic city with its many art deco landmarks. See photos from Napier here.

QUEENSTOWN/CENTRAL OTAGO POST-TOUR



Following our stay in Auckland, 45 members boarded a flight to Queenstown in the South Island of New Zealand. Set against the dramatic backdrop of the Remarkables mountain range, where Lord of the Rings was filmed, we arrived (after two unsuccessful attempts to land due to heavy tail winds), in the picturesque city of Queenstown.



Now within spitting distance of NZ's famous Pinot Noir wine country, Central Otago, we were keen to start the Pinot pilgrimage. Highlights were many. Highly regarded Grant Taylor of Valli Wines gave us a wonderful insight to the area and Valli wines. At Felton Road, Blair Walter conducted a tutored tasting, including the recently awarded 2017 Felton Road Pinot which Bob Campbell had given 100 points - only the second time he has awarded 100 points. Visits to Carrick and Mt Difficulty wineries were also excellent.



We ate well but of special note must be the oysters. Bluff oysters are expensive, larger than most, very creamy, and are considered to be the South Island's most famous delicacy. Very glad they were in season while we were there - we couldn't get enough. Auckland President Rowan Moss made it clear he pays homage to them on a regular basis - we understand Rowan.

ANDRÉ SIMON LECTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THE NEW ZEALAND WINE INDUSTRY - 1954 TO THE PRESENT DAY

Bob Campbell MW, also recognised as Mr New Zealand for wine, presented the 2019 André Simon Lecture to close the Auckland festival weekend. His lecture focussed on how the New Zealand wine industry has evolved - touching on failures in the vineyards, their first wines and key grape varieties. I am pleased to announce that next year's André Simon Lecture will be delivered by Jane Anson. She is the Bordeaux correspondent and columnist for *Decanter Magazine* and has won several awards for her writing, including the Louis Roederer Wine Feature Writer of the Year. Jane has lived in Bordeaux since 2003 and is an accredited wine teacher at the Bordeaux Ecole du Vin. She is the author of Bordeaux Legends (2013), The Club of Nine, (2016), Wine Revolution (2017) and co-author of the Michelin Guide to the Wine Regions of France (2010).



She is currently working on a definitive guide to Bordeaux wines which will be published in the Spring of 2020. Her lecture will be delivered during the Paris and Bordeaux Festival on 24 April 2020.
