## MELBOURNE INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL (AUSTRALIA) NOV 11-15 2015



#### The Main Event - Melbourne 160 attendees enjoyed a fabulous 5 days in Melbourne. Opening the festival at Melbourne's premier Vue de Monde Restaurant was a special way to start. We then travelled to Cape Schanck on the Mornington Peninsula for a



tutored tasting of local Chardonnay and Pinot Noir, to Circa for a great lunch prepared by Ashly Hicks and our Andre Simon lecture presented by wine guru Philip Rich. Dinner followed at The Point on the beautiful Albert Park Lake, prepared by Chef Andy Harmer. Then to the Lake House at Daylesford for a tutored tasting of Chardonnay and Pinot from the Mt Macedon region, led by Phillip Moraghan of Curly Flat and Michael Dhillon of Bindi. The food by Chef Alla Wolf-Tasker, focused on local produce from this charming area. We arrived back in good time for our Gala Dinner at Crown, where we feasted well and danced into the wee hours. Our final day saw us enjoy a delicious yum-cha luncheon at Red Emperor, and for those who didn't want to go home, an After Party Dinner at one of Melbourne's longest established restaurants – Matteo's.



We showed a good range of Australian wines, especially Victorian wines, where Pinot prevails. But we still brought out one of Australia's iconic wines – Penfold's Grange – from the brilliant vintage of 2004. We also showed old world wines alongside the local wines so that attendees

could compare the two origins, including the great Grand Crus of Clos de Beze, Clos de la Roche, Grands Echezeaux and Clos Vougeot. We also presented Australian produce such as kangaroo, marron, yabbies, wallaby and local cheeses. And yes, they got the chance to see kangaroos in their natural habitat!
