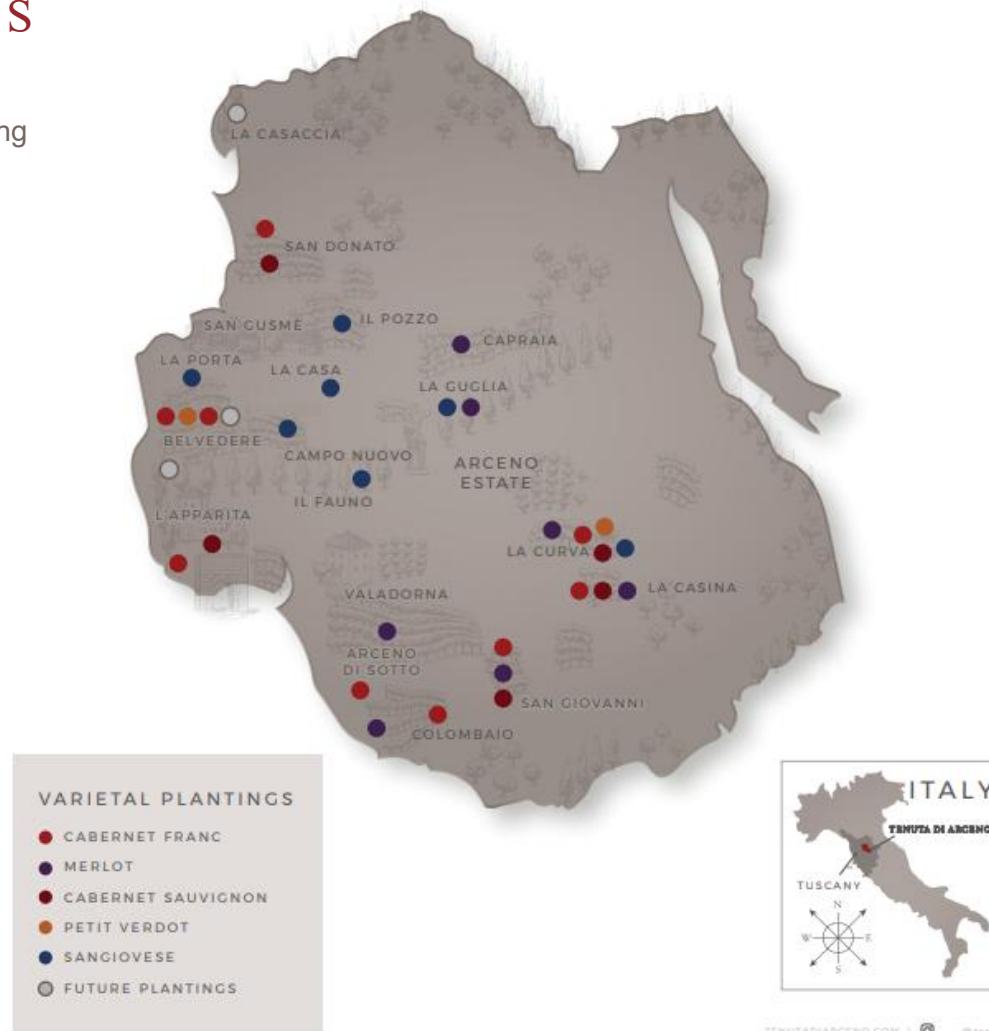


VARIETAL PLANTINGS

ARCANUM

Arcanum is the pinnacle offering from Tenuta di Arceno. A Cabernet Franc that embodies a sense-of-place, distinctive of the diverse micro-crus of each vineyard block hand-selected for this vintage. Inviting aromas of sweet mint and vanilla bean delight the senses, underscored by white pepper spice. The palate exudes elegance with a distinctive brightness and soft, fine tannins. A core of tart cherries and black licorice are rounded out by a lingering finish of cedar and balsamic notes.

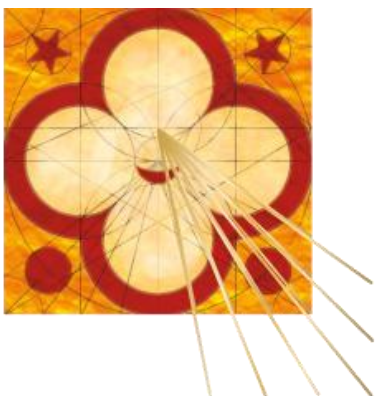

- With superb exposure and sandy clay soils, each year these blocks shine to produce the finest expression of the variety and the leading wine of the estate





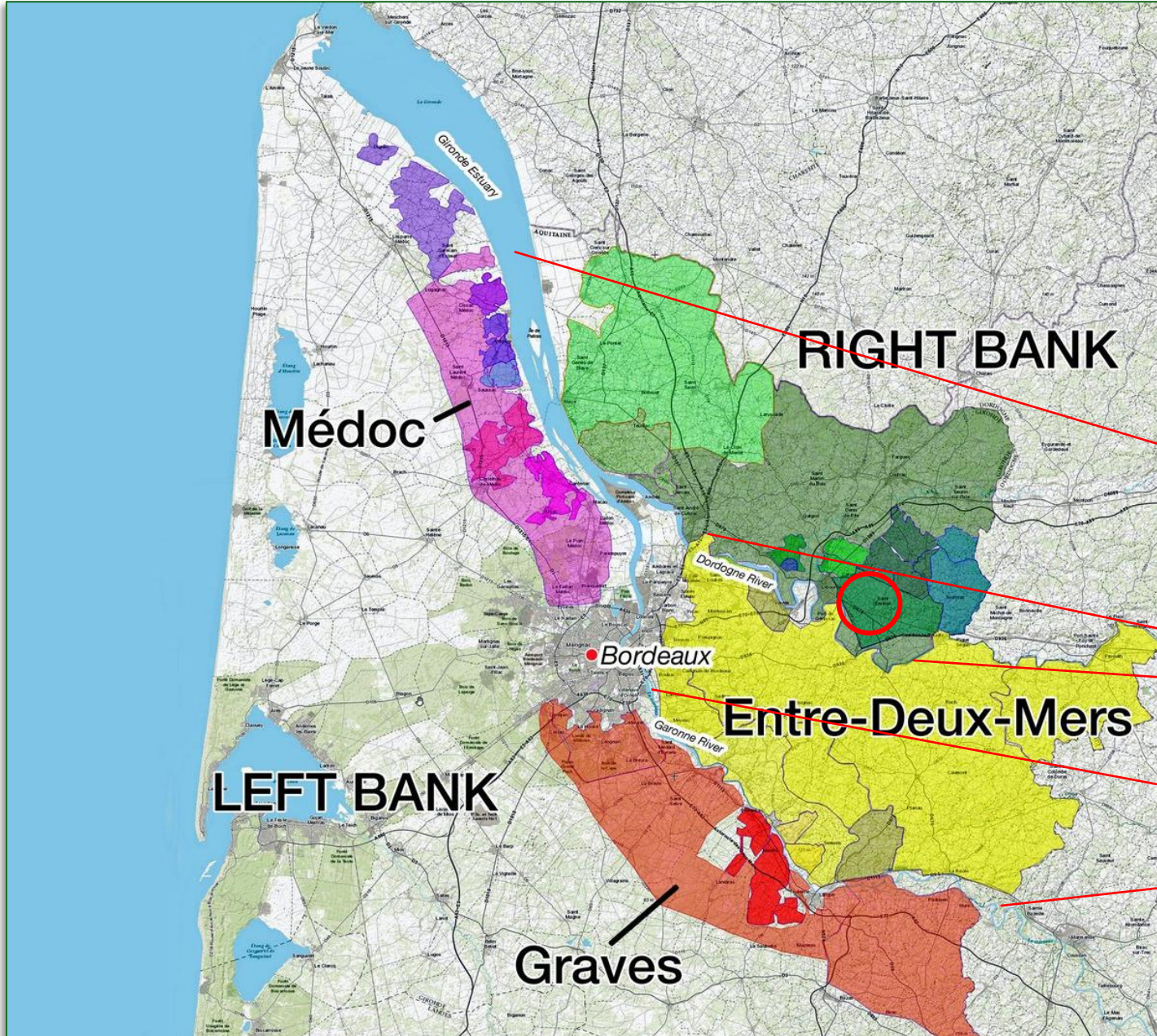

Nestled on the Côte de Saint-Émilion with its striking 18th century château, perennially sundrenched vineyards and diverse soils, Château Lassègue sits in a unique position of honoring its heritage while also moving into a new era of winemaking tradition.

2021 VINTAGE NOTES

- April frost affected the entirety of Bordeaux, but the Chateau Lassègue vineyards benefitted from natural positioning, high on the Côte de Saint-Émilion.
- The summer was cool and humid, requiring careful attention to support canopy growth, driving ripeness in the fruit.
- Late summer weather turned warm and sunny, rewarding our efforts in the vineyards, and leading to very good phenolic ripeness. Harvest took place between September 29th and October 14th.

TASTING NOTES

- 2021 Lassègue is characterized by a bright deep ruby-violet color, with an expressive bouquet. Youthful aromas of fresh red cherry, and red currant evolve into notes of violets, with a touch of oak.
- The mid-palate offers a beautiful complexity of spices and red fruits, then continues with well-integrated tannins. This vintage is characterized by its balanced fruity expression, as well as its minerality and very pleasant freshness.

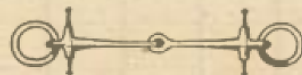
ABOUT ANAKOTA

Grown in the volcanic soils of our estate-owned, Knights Valley vineyards, Anakota embodies the rustic elegance and spirit of rural Sonoma County. Our vineyards climb the southwest-facing slopes of 4,300ft. Mount St. Helena, and are surrounded by a wilderness of cold mountain streams and forests of native fir and oak. The message of our soil, as expressed by the subtle variations of topography and geology, is conveyed in every bottle.

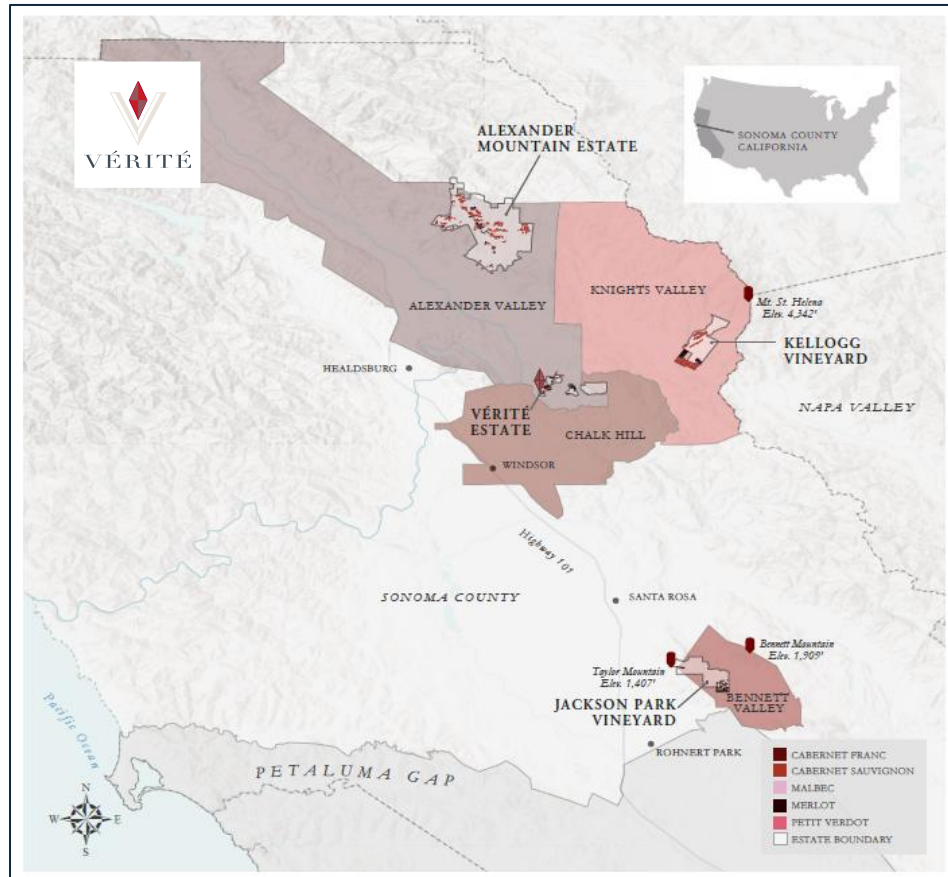




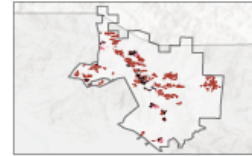

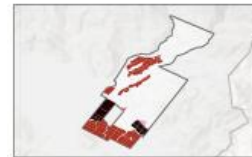

The diversity of Sonoma County is mirrored in our estate vineyards. The soils and microclimates in our mountain and hillside vineyards vary dramatically from block to block, creating what we like to think of as small vineyards within vineyards—our palette of soil types. Each is distinct from the others, so we call these special blocks *micro-crus*. They are the heart and soul of our terroir philosophy at Vérité. Everything we do here—from the vineyard to the bottle—we do with the goal of allowing these micro-crus to transmit the message, or truth, of our soil in Sonoma County. The truth is in our soil and speaks clearly through our wines.

MICRO-CRU PHILOSOPHY

A mosaic of more than 50 micro-crus provides Vignerons Pierre and H el ene Seillan with a complex palette of aromatics, flavors, textures, and structural elements to craft the wines of V erit e.

Each micro-cru is harvested and fermented separately, then aged in French oak barrels of various custom toasts. This provides hundreds of unique components to create the architecture of the final blends of La Muse, La Joie, and Le D esir.



2019 VINTAGE OVERVIEW



“The 2019 Vérité wines display purity and focus, reflecting their Sonoma terroir, vintage characteristics, and individual signatures. These expressive and seamless wines will reward patience in your cellar for years to come.”

The 2019 vintage unfolded without extremes. Much needed winter rains transitioned into a cool spring, resulting in an abundant fruit set. Yields were carefully managed to ensure harmony within the vine system. The weather was warm and dry throughout the summer, with a consistency of daytime temperature that was ideal for slow and even ripening. September and October were mild; without the threat of extreme heat or rain, harvest could proceed at a deliberate pace, allowing each micro-cru to be picked at the ideal maturity. The 2019 harvest began on September 12th and ended on October 4th.

2019 LA JOIE

La Joie *Joy*

Inspired by the classic wines from the Pauillac region of Bordeaux, La Joie is blended from numerous mature plantings of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, and Petit Verdot, grown along the steep hillsides and volcanic benches of the Mayacamas Mountains.

Aroma: Fresh plum, crushed pomegranate, and black currant, combine with, sage, fresh bay leaf, and dried clove.

Palate: Dried blackcurrant and warm black plum compote with savory undertones of maduro tobacco, toasted brown butter, and an earthy element of iron minerality. The muscular structure is marked by robust tannins and brilliant acidity.

Appellation: 100% Sonoma County

Composition: 84% Cabernet Sauvignon, 7% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc, 4% Petit Verdot

Specifics: 14.3% Alcohol

Aging: 16 months in 100% French oak, 95% new
