WINES DECANTED AND DELIVERED TO YOUR DOOR

In April members, and guests, of the Blackpool & Fylde Coast Branch took delivery of a selection of Australian wines chosen by their Chairman Ron Barker. The branch purchased the wines, decanted them into specially purchased 250ml bottles and then branch officers took charge of delivery to the attendees. Later that day members were able to join virtually via Zoom... The wines represented a mixture of wines available from merchants and supermarkets. Tasmanian Riesling divided the Riesling lovers and haters with Shelley's Block Marsanne, Viognier and

Roussanne being the favourite white. Of the reds: members favoured the Berton Vineyard Shiraz from Barossa Valley. The Chadwick family of Rigby's Farmhouse restaurant even devised a delicious menu to accompany the wines.

In May they will be arranging another home delivery of Spanish wines and regulations permitting; hope to hold a garden tasting of Sicilian wines in June.



LOCKDOWN WITH CHOCOLATE

The London branch are continuing with their Zoom events, where distance is no object, including welcoming members from other branches. One of their latest tastings turned to chocolate and focussed on a Chocolate Tasting at Home. The event was led by Chantal Coady OBE, internationally renowned chocolate expert, who invited members to compare top quality



chocolates, which had been sent 'blind' to the attendees, against various recommended bottles of alcohol that they got for themselves. Recently their more traditional wine tastings have featured 'Sangiovese from Tuscany' and 'An Italian Trio', of Gavi, Valpolicella Ripasso and Nero d'Avola. They have also held a Wine Appreciation course by Zoom, based on the WSET level 2 material. Members are kept in touch regularly of what is happening via email and a blog.
