OUR FESTIVALS

In May we made it to ALSACE and PIEDMONT

After postponements, both these festivals took place in successive weeks at the end of April/beginning of May. In total, 68 different members took part with 12



attending both festivals. Of these, 46 were members from EAZ, 17 from Americas, 11 of whom travelled to the Paris and Bordeaux festival and only two from APZ due to the uncertainties for travel in Asia Pacific. The relaxation of Covid restrictions in Europe enabled these festivals to be enjoyed.

We were honoured by the presence in Piedmont of Michael Tamburri, from Australia the current Chair of Council. Two



former Chairs attended: Ian Nicol, at both festivals, and Chris Bonsall, in Piedmont. During the Piedmont festival, Chris was announced as the Honourary President of the Society in succession to Dave Felton. Here you can see Michael (right) congratulating

Thanks, on behalf of IWFS and me, John Nicholas (EAZ Chair) to Stephanie Shepherd. Before her retirement from the role of EAZ Festivals Co-ordinator, she had overseen these two festivals. She held the role for the last nine years, organising many successful EAZ festivals herself, including the memorable London triennial festival in 2018 and ensured the success of others.

Black Pudding is the key ingredient of our competition which began in April with catering students across the North

competing to create a dish with black pudding at its core. The regional heats are nearing conclusion, before the Grand Final in May and a prestigious Awards Lunch on 28th June.

have now become enthusiasts and colleges are even now asking for it to be repeated in future!! Colleges have shared the results on their social media streams, raising the profile of the Society in the process. The Merseyside and Mid-Cheshire Branch have presented three Excellence Awards: Buckley's Restaurant and The Yellow Broom (already reported),



more recently the prestigious Spirit Restaurant & Bar in Warrington with a fourth ready for presentation to the Grosvenor Hotel in Chester. Award recipient, Paul Ratcliffe, of Buckley's, Chef Lecturer & Course Leader in Hospitality &



Catering said "It is incredible to receive this award from the International Wine & Food Society. Our students work hard to master their craft, and to be recognised for this by such a prestigious organisation motivates and enthuses our learners in their pursuit for excellence". According to Tim Hodges, Branch Chairman, the conclusion so far is that the Excellence Award opens up new channels with hospitality and forges a firmer link with

venues which in the longer term should raise the IWFS profile and member numbers.

Leonie Allday, Bath & Bristol Branch Chair is also pleased to announce that they have now made the first Excellence Award in the South West to The Carpenters Arms, Stanton Wick. It is a traditional, family-run country pub with which the branch has had a great relationship for many years. Despite the many pressures on hospitality arising from the 'double whammy' of Covid and Brexit, and the fact that like many other venues they are short of staff, they have managed to maintain their high standards.
