It is great that Europe Africa branches have returned to "normal business" after the disruptions caused by Covid. There are still restrictions in some parts of the world, mainly in

Asia, but also for travel to the US for those who are not vaccinated. We are confidently planning Europe Africa showcase festivals for 2023, see page 3 and our Dates for the Diary, and already have ideas for 2024.

The Executive Committee recently reviewed a paper "Strategy for Growth" and approved it and the need for investment. The proposals for the future of IWFS Europe Africa were prepared by members from several branches, led by Stephen Harrison, Chair of West Yorkshire branch. The main objective of the review has been "how to stem the decline of IWFS membership" and in particular "how to widen the profile of IWFS using today's communication methods". The report sets out five specific areas on which to concentrate and these were discussed at the AGM/Members' Forum in Torquay. More detail will appear in the next edition of F&W. As we start to implement the proposals, we will need help from branches and commitment from members to "make it happen".

UPCOMING FESTIVALS

A SPANISH SPECIAL: Catalonia – D.O Empordà and Barcelona, 23rd to 27th May 2023



We begin in Barcelona, festivalgoers will then venture on a tour of the D.O. Empordà wine region, including three nights at the Perelada Golf and

Spa resort hotel and then return to Barcelona via the extraordinary volcanic Garrotxa region. The journey will close at the festival's 5-star <u>Hotel El Palace</u> in Barcelona. The festival will follow Spanish timings with late lunches (2 pm) and dinners (8 pm), be prepared!

The festival features an evening of music and art; dinner and a wine tasting in a private club; three dinners in Michelin star restaurants; four lunches as well as visits to wineries, museums and historic buildings.
